Can you recognize a phishing email?

- Many phishing scams ask recipients to provide personal information
- Make sure the email is from a legitimate source
- If the email is from an entity that you know, make sure the tone and grammar are correct
- Be wary of any items that your email application marked as junk or spam

## Can you recognize a non-secure website?

- Is the website you're on asking you to enter sensitive information?  
If so, ask yourself...
  - Is there a lock in the URL bar?
  - Does the URL contain "HTTPS"?
  - Did I get any kind of error or warning when connecting to the website?

## Don't let down your guard.

Can you recognize malicious software?

- When searching the web for software, be wary of any downloads from sites that didn't author the software
- Only download software from sites that you trust or have heard of
- Make sure the installation process displays a "verified publisher"
