

Project Management: Fundamentals of Predictive and Adaptive Methods (095032)

This bridge document is written for instructors who have used Logical Operations' *Project Management Fundamentals (Third Edition)* courseware (095015) and want to come up to speed on the new *Project Management: Fundamentals of Predictive and Adaptive Methods* courseware quickly and efficiently.

Overview of Changes

Even though the title is different, this course is a successor to *Project Management Fundamentals (Third Edition)*. Its new title reflects how it has been expanded to two days of coverage to incorporate material on modern adaptive Project Management methods such as Agile.

(Training delivery organizations who prefer to focus on a traditional predictive project management approach in a compact one-day format can continue to offer our popular *Project Management Fundamentals (Third Edition)*.)

In this new *Project Management: Fundamentals of Predictive and Adaptive Methods* course, the lesson-level structural changes are as follows:

- Lesson 1 introduces the two types of approaches to project management—Predictive and Adaptive—and compares their basic characteristics and differences.
- The flow of the lessons continues to correspond to the general flow of a project: initiation, planning, executing, and closing. The Predictive and Adaptive concepts are distributed within the lessons in which they are applicable to the project. Also, some titles have changed to reflect the inclusion of the Adaptive approach. For example, “Identify the Role of the Project Manager” has changed to “Identify the Leadership Roles in a Project.”
- Lesson 3, Topic B now combines activity dependencies and sequencing, and the Precedence Diagramming Method to identify the critical path of a project.
- Lesson 4 is completely new and focuses on planning Adaptive projects, as the process is significantly different from planning Predictive projects.
- Lesson 6, Topic C is newly focused on tracking the progress of an Adaptive project. To that end, the Earned Value Analysis content has been moved to Appendix A.
- Lesson 7, Topic A has been added to include closing Adaptive projects.
- Mastery Builders for additional practice have been added.
